

Seeking applicants to join our Board of Directors

Knowles Centre is a not-for-profit organization that has been part of the Winnipeg community since 1907. We provide long-term treatment services and skill-based programs for almost 300 young people and their families annually. Many have histories of trauma, abuse, and neglect, or come from families that have been challenged by intergenerational trauma. At Knowles Centre, they receive the help they need to heal their hearts, minds, and souls, and find a path to a better future.

We are seeking community members who want to help make a difference in their community. In particular, we are seeking people who have experience in finance, accounting, law, property management, marketing, fundraising and Indigenous issues and culture. Indigenous candidates and residents of the northeast Winnipeg community are especially encouraged to apply.

Duties & Responsibilities

As a member of the Board of Directors, members:

- Perform all duties in keeping with the by-laws of the organization, internal policies, and relevant Provincial legislation and regulations
- Hire and work with the CEO, and complete required performance reviews
- Option to be a member of board committees
 - Finance
 - Nominating
 - Fundraising
- Provide financial oversight
- Review and approve relevant policy
- Contribute professional knowledge to program review and agency development.
- Commit approximately 3 to 5 hours each month in person or in online meetings and discussions_

Expectations

- Participate in monthly meetings of the full Board of Directors (held Sept. through Nov. and Jan. through June).
- Attend the annual general meeting (held in September)
- Committee members may meet as required, in person or virtually
- Represent the agency, as required, in meetings with stakeholders such as the Province of Manitoba, River East Transcona School Division, and the United Way of Winnipeg
- Support all fundraising efforts of the agency at a level commensurate with the role, but within the means of the individual board member.

Orientation & Training

- An orientation session regarding Knowles Centre and its programs, services and governance is provided to incoming members of the Board of Directors by the CEO.
- Board members may attend staff development sessions hosted by Knowles Centre, regarding issues in family and youth development, treatment, cultural awareness, etc.
- Board members may receive financial support from the agency to attend professional development training related to board or agency concerns provided by external organizations in the community.

Term

- Members of the Board of Directors are elected for a one-year term (July 1 – June 30) and may be re-elected.

Benefits

- Opportunity to contribute to the operations of a respected community-based organization and work with a dedicated team of volunteers
- Gain skills in communication, meeting management and knowledge of a historic non-profit that has been a part of the community since 1907.
- This is a volunteer opportunity. Members of the Board of Directors receive no remuneration for their contributions.
- Eligible expenses incurred while performing board duties will be reimbursed.
